Required Paperwork

We are including a Snow School Waiver, Rental Waiver form, and a Tubing Waiver for you to sign. These forms can be filled out and returned to your school to then send to Baldy Mountain Resort.

Every participant **MUST** have a signed Snow School Waiver.

If your child requires rentals, please fill in the Rental Agreement form. If your child has his/her own equipment, you will not need to sign the agreement.

If your school is participating in tubing, every student **MUST** have a signed Tubing Waiver.

Tips for a Successful Visit

Clothing Guidelines:

Here are some guidelines for how to dress for your trip to Baldy. Remember, it is best to LAYER clothing in case of weather changes. Bring a backpack or gym bag to store shoes and extra clothing.

FEET - Socks should fit snugly but not tight - ONE good pair will be fine (not too thick). Bring one extra pair. Remember cotton is cold! Wool or synthetics are best.

PANTS - Long underwear and ski pants OR sweatpants/tights and rain shell pant. (Please NO JEANS if possible as jeans bunch up in ski boots, get cold easily, and are uncomfortable around the legs.)

BODY – A thin synthetic layer next to the skin with a fleece or wool layer over the first layer. The outer layer should be a jacket with water resistant qualities.

HAT/HELMET - All alpine skiers and snowboarders are required to use a helmet. The helmets provided by Baldy provide the warmth of a good hat. It is recommended that students bring a thin hat to wear under the helmet in case the helmet doesn't provide enough warmth. If the student/group member intends to bring his or her own helmet it must be certified for snow sports. A hat or headband is recommended for cross-country skiers as long as it covers the ears.

HANDS - SKI GLOVES / MITTENS (a spare pair is a good idea)

EYES - GOGGLES or sunglasses (ultra violet rated)

FACE - SUNSCREEN (minimum 15 SPF)



OPTIONAL - Neck gator / Face mask / Change of clothes

Baldy Mountain Resort has cell service through Telus.

Complimentary Admission for Teachers and Supervising Adults

Baldy Mountain Resort offers complimentary lift tickets for teachers and supervising adults accompanying students on their activity day. We require a minimum of 1 chaperone per 10 children and offer 4 free chaperone tickets for any given school group date.

RENTAL AGREEMENT

1. I accept full responsibility for the care of the rental equipment ("the Equipment") listed on this form and I agree to pay for any damage to the Equipment and replace at full retail value any Equipment not returned by the agreed date.
2. I am familiar with the proper use of the Equipment. I understand that the rental technicians are able to answer questions I may have as to the proper use of the Equipment.
3. [DOWNHILL SKI EQUIPMENT ONLY] I have made no misrepresentation in regard to my height, weight, age or skier type. (This information is required in order to properly adjust the ski boot/binding settings). I agree to verify that the settings appearing in the visual indicator windows on the bindings correspond with the settings to be recorded on this form.

ASSUMPTION OF RISKS

I am aware that skiing, snowboarding and snowshoeing involve risks, dangers and hazards and that injuries are a common and ordinary occurrence in these sports.

ALPINE SKIING I understand that the ski boot/binding system may not release during every fall or may release unexpectedly. The ski boot/binding system is no guarantee that the user will not be injured.

SNOWBOARDING/ SNOWSHOEING I understand that the boot/binding system is not designed or intended to release and will not release under normal circumstances. I understand that as the boot/binding system is a non-release system, this system will not reduce the risk of injury during a fall and will increase the risk of not surviving an avalanche.

HELMETS I understand that a helmet designed for recreational snow sports may reduce the risk of some types of head injuries. I recognize that serious head injury can occur even when a helmet is worn.

I FREELY ACCEPT AND FULLY ASSUME ALL RISKS, DANGERS AND HAZARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THE USE OF THE EQUIPMENT.

RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

In consideration of the rental of the Equipment, I hereby agree as follows:

1. I AGREE TO WAIVE ANY AND ALL CLAIMS that I have or may in the future have against the Releasees and TO RELEASE THE RELEASEES from any and all liability for any damage, expense or injury (including death) that I may suffer, or that my next of kin may suffer, resulting from or arising out of any aspect of my use of the Equipment or my presence on the Premises, DUE TO ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE, BREACH OF CONTRACT OR BREACH OF STATUTORY DUTY OF CARE, INCLUDING ANY DUTY OWED UNDER THE OCCUPIERS LIABILITY ACT, R.S.B.C. 1996, c.337, in respect of the design, manufacture, installation, maintenance, selection or adjustment of the Equipment, or in respect of the provision of or the failure to provide any warnings, directions or instructions as to the use of the Equipment or the risks, dangers and hazards of skiing, snowboarding and snowshoeing.
2. TO HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY THE RELEASEES from any and all liability for any damage to property or personal injury to any third party, resulting from my use of the Equipment;
3. This Release Agreement shall be effective and binding upon my heirs, next of kin, executors, administrators, assigns and representatives, in the event of my death or incapacity;
4. This Release Agreement and any rights, duties and obligations as between the parties to this Release Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted solely in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia and no other jurisdiction; and
5. Any litigation involving the parties to this Release Agreement shall be brought solely within the Province of British Columbia and shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of the Province of British Columbia.

I am also aware that the risks, dangers and hazards referred to above exist through the ski area and many are unmarked. I freely accept and fully assume all such risks, dangers, and hazards and the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage, and loss resulting there from.

CLOTHING GUIDELINES

SOCKS:	Snug fitting socks are best (not tight). Please wear one pair and bring an extra pair. Cotton is cold! Wool or synthetics are best.
PANTS:	Long underwear and ski/snow pants OR sweatpants/tights and rain shell pants. Please NO JEANS if possible as jeans bunch up in ski boots, get cold easily, and are uncomfortable around the legs.
BODY:	A thin synthetic layer next to the skin with a fleece or wool layer over the first layer. The outer layer should be a jacket with water-resistant qualities.
HEAD:	Helmet. All alpine skiers and snowboarders are required to use a helmet. The helmets provided by the ski hill provide the warmth of a good toque. It is recommended that students bring a thin toque to wear under the helmet in case it doesn't provide enough warmth. <u>If the student/group member intends to bring his/her own helmet, it must be certified for snow sports.</u>
HANDS:	Ski gloves or mittens with water-resistant qualities (a spare pair is a good idea). Knit gloves or mittens are discouraged.
EYES:	Goggles or sunglasses with UV protection
FACE:	Sunscreen (minimum 15 SPF)
OPTIONAL:	Neck gator, face mask, change of clothes

STAYING FED AND HYDRATED

WATER BOTTLE:	Please make sure it has a tight-fitting lid and is filled before arriving at the hill.
WARM DRINK:	Thermos of hot chocolate or tea (optional). Sometimes warms from inside out.
LUNCH:	Please send a healthy, hearty lunch/snack that does not require microwaving. If utensils are needed, please send those along as well.
CONCESSION:	The concession is usually available. Students are encouraged to purchase appropriate lunch items and limit their purchases of junk food.
LODGE:	The upper lodge is off-limits to students when skiing at Mt. Baldy on a school trip.

OTHER EXPECTATIONS WHILE ON THE TRIP

RESPECT:	Toward all ski hill staff, chaperones, as well as school staff and students.
POSITIVE ATTITUDE:	Like school, this is a learning environment. It may require more effort for some and feel difficult at first. Keep working hard and don't give up. Encourage your friends.
STICK TOGETHER:	It is important to ALWAYS ski or snowboard with a partner. This is for safety, as well as fun.
LISTEN:	Be receptive to new learning from instructors. Be aware and listen to staff when they give reminders for last run, equipment returns, and time to board the bus.
